
About UCP Suffolk

- UCP Suffolk provides programs and services for almost 3,500 children and adults with disabilities and their families.
- It is one of the largest of the 100 affiliates in the national United Cerebral Palsy network.
- UCP Suffolk boasts more than 60 years of experience in providing exemplary services for persons with disabilities.
- UCP delivers services to individuals with cerebral palsy (35%) and other disabilities (65%) such as multiple sclerosis, traumatic brain injury, spina bifida and other developmental delays.
- UCP Suffolk operates a year round Educational Program (serving infants and children through 21 years of age) and a Health Center, which provides fully accessible dental, medical, rehabilitative and mental health services and assistive technology.
 - Adult Day Service Programs include; day treatment, community habilitation, day habilitation, service coordination, respites, vocational training, job placement thru The Employment Connection.
- UCP Suffolk owns and operates more than 30 residential homes throughout Suffolk County.
 - UCP Suffolk manages a federally funded 12-unit accessible apartment complex for individuals with developmental disabilities.

The children live in an accessible and comfortable home supported by an interdisciplinary team that monitors the needs, strengths and progress of each child. The skills learned at school and in the home are reinforced and practiced in both settings. Our homes are located in neighborhoods close to our school and fully accessible health center.
